### Academic Entry requirements:

Applicants must be year 12 or equivalent or mature age. You will need a reference from your local Pastor and must fulfil all enrolment requirements. Applicants under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian approval. Overseas students have no English language requirements, unless otherwise stated as per the Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC) student visa requirements.

### Course Structure

The Certificate III in Christian Ministry and Theology requires the successful completion of 6 subjects over 2 terms (3 subjects per term). Overseas students are required to complete an extra subject each term (total of 8 subjects).

### Assessment

Exercises, questions, case scenarios, research and workplace competency.

### Vocational Placement (VP)

In addition to study time students are required to complete 120 hours of volunteer work within their local church or a community based organisation. This volunteer work is called "Vocational Placement" and includes ministry within the church e.g. serving in a ministry team such as hospitality, music, children or administration; and/or ministry within a community organisation e.g. youth work, chaplaincy, RE in schools. Attending meetings does not qualify.

### **Recognition of Prior Learning**

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is a process where students may be granted credit towards a qualification in recognition of their prior skills and knowledge gained through work experience, life experience and/or formal training.
