Entry Criteria

Diploma of Christian Ministry or Theology (minimum of 1216 nominal hours)

Course Structure

The Diploma of Christian Ministry requires the successful completion of 12 subjects over 4 terms (3 subjects per term). Overseas students are required to complete an extra subject each term (total of 16 subjects).

Assessment

Exercises, questions, case scenarios, research and workplace competency.

Vocational Placement (VP)

In addition to study time students are required to complete 240 hours of volunteer work within their local church and/or a community based organisation. This volunteer work is called "Vocational Placement". Advanced Diploma students are expected to minister in a leadership role within their local church and/or community organisation, where they are required to develop others.
