This qualification prepares Christians for effective ministry within their local church, community and professional marketplace. Some denominations require a Certificate IV for ordination as a Pastor.

Academic Entry requirements:

Applicants must be year 12 or equivalent, or mature age. You will need a reference from your local Pastor and must fulfil all enrolment requirements. Applicants under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian approval.

Assessment

Exercises, questions, case scenarios, research and workplace competency.

Vocational Placement

In addition to study time students are required to complete 240 hours of volunteer work within their local church or a community based organisation. This volunteer work is called "Vocational Placement" and includes ministry within the church e.g. serving in a ministry team such as hospitality, music, children or administration; and/or ministry within a community organisation e.g. youth work, chaplaincy, RE in schools. Attending meetings does not qualify.

Support services

Training support is provided by Hope College staff via phone, email and/or internet for the duration of the course.

On-going Education Options

Completion of this course qualifies you for entry into the Diploma in Christian Ministry and Theology and will provide partial Direct Credit Transfer into the following: Certificate IV in Business, Certificate IV in Community Services Work, Certificate IV in Youth Work, Certificate IV in Mental Health Work – (Non-clinical) and a range of other nationally recognised qualifications.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is a process where students may be granted credit towards a qualification in recognition of their prior skills and knowledge gained through work experience, life experience and/or formal training. The process requires students to gather evidence of their skills. Fees apply. Ask Hope College for an RPL application form.

Centrelink Study Allowance

This course is Centrelink approved. You may qualify for Austudy, Youth Allowance, Abstudy or PES.
